Bar Service, Mocktails	5 – 7 June	L1	2	Get maritime safe before summer and learn a maritime VHF radio's features and functions.
Maritime VHF	10 – 11 June	L3	2	The Maritime VHF Operator course teaches correct radio operation and distress procedures, as well as other important skills such as weather services and search and rescue equipment. Unit Standard 19491.
Barista Coffee	18 – 20 June	L2	4	Learn basic barista skills by preparing espresso beverages under supervision. Unit Standard 17285.
Café Table Service	25 – 27 June	L2	3	Gain hospitality skills in a 'real-world' café service environment. Students will participate in Rata Room café services, preparing and clearing customer dining and service areas and equipment. Unit Standard 14434.
Automotive, Intermediate	2 – 3 July	L1	–	Learn safe work practices and the basic knowledge and skills to strip and reassemble a four-stroke engine.
Hairdressing Salon Skills	2 – 4 July	L2	3	Learn hairdressing skills in a salon environment, including shampooing and styling long hair. Also, understand sustainability concepts relevant to the industry such as waste reduction, recycling, and carbon footprint management. Unit Standard 28027.
Barista Coffee	2 – 4 July	L2	4	Learn basic barista skills by preparing espresso beverages under supervision. Unit Standard 17285.
Patisserie Cooking and Baking	2 – 4 July	L2	2	Gain cookery skills in a 'real-world' commercial kitchen service environment. Participate in the preparation for Rata Room café services by baking a range of cakes, bread and pastries for customers. Unit Standard 13272.
Café Table Service	29 – 31 July	L2	3	Gain hospitality skills in a 'real-world' café service environment. Students will participate in Rata Room café services, preparing and clearing customer dining and service areas and equipment. Unit Standard 14434.
Barista Coffee	5 – 7 August	L2	4	Learn basic barista skills by preparing espresso beverages under supervision. Unit Standard 17285.
Building and Joinery	7 – 8 August	L1	–	Get tooled up in the joinery workshop and experience creating a project of your own using hand and power tools.
Bar Service, Mocktails	21 – 22 August	L1	2	Gain hospitality skills in a 'real-world' bar service environment. Students will prepare and serve a range of non-alcoholic drinks to customers. Unit Standard 21057.
Beauty Skills	4 – 6 September	L2	3	Students will develop an understanding of technical skills used in beauty therapy clinics, by observing practical demonstrations and performing beauty services. Unit Standard 28027.
Beauty Skills (Marlborough)	10 – 12 September	L2	3	Students will develop an understanding of technical skills used in beauty therapy clinics, by observing practical demonstrations and performing beauty services. Unit Standard 28027.
Engineering Welding, Intermediate	18 – 19 September	L1	–	This 2-day course provides students with an intermediate understanding of basic MIG welding. Students with no welding experience are welcome to attend.
Cookery, Gourmet to go	22 – 23 October	L3	2	Learn sandwich making and cooking techniques in a commercial kitchen. Create innovative presentations using fresh ingredients with different flavors and textures. Prepare sandwiches for Rata Room café customers. Unit Standard 13282.
